Focus Areas



Market Engagement

We create a channel for industry to engage with commercial and government partners, promoting growth in the adoption of cyber technologies and services across key sectors in the UK and internationally.



Policy Development

We provide a platform for engagement between industry and government on cyber resilience policy interventions, most notably the National Cyber Action Plan and the Cyber Security & Resilience Bill.



Fostering the eco-system

We support broader initiatives to grow the cyber sector, with a focus on boosting cyber resilience in the nations and regions, while supporting the growing and vibrant SME community.

Market Engagement

The programme supports market engagement activity across three key areas:

Public Sector

We work to give industry sight of government priorities for the development of cyber capabilities withing individual government departments including procurement plans and pipeline. techUK explores how industry can better engage throughout procurement cycle to strengthen resilience across Government.

Private Sector

Currently focusing on Critical National Infrastructure (CNI) and 4IR, the Programme holds a number of sector specific events to understand key challenges and opportunities for industry. We do so by partnering with industry specific trade and regulatory bodies to bring cyber members together with industry counterparts.

Exports

Cyber Security exports are the fastest growing element of the UK SE's remit. The programme works with the Department for Business and Trade colleagues to support UK companies in exporting, with a focus on 5-Eyes countries, the Gulf and the EU. Through these events we deliver a mixture of market intelligence and practical advice around engaging in country.

The Cyber Resilience Committee

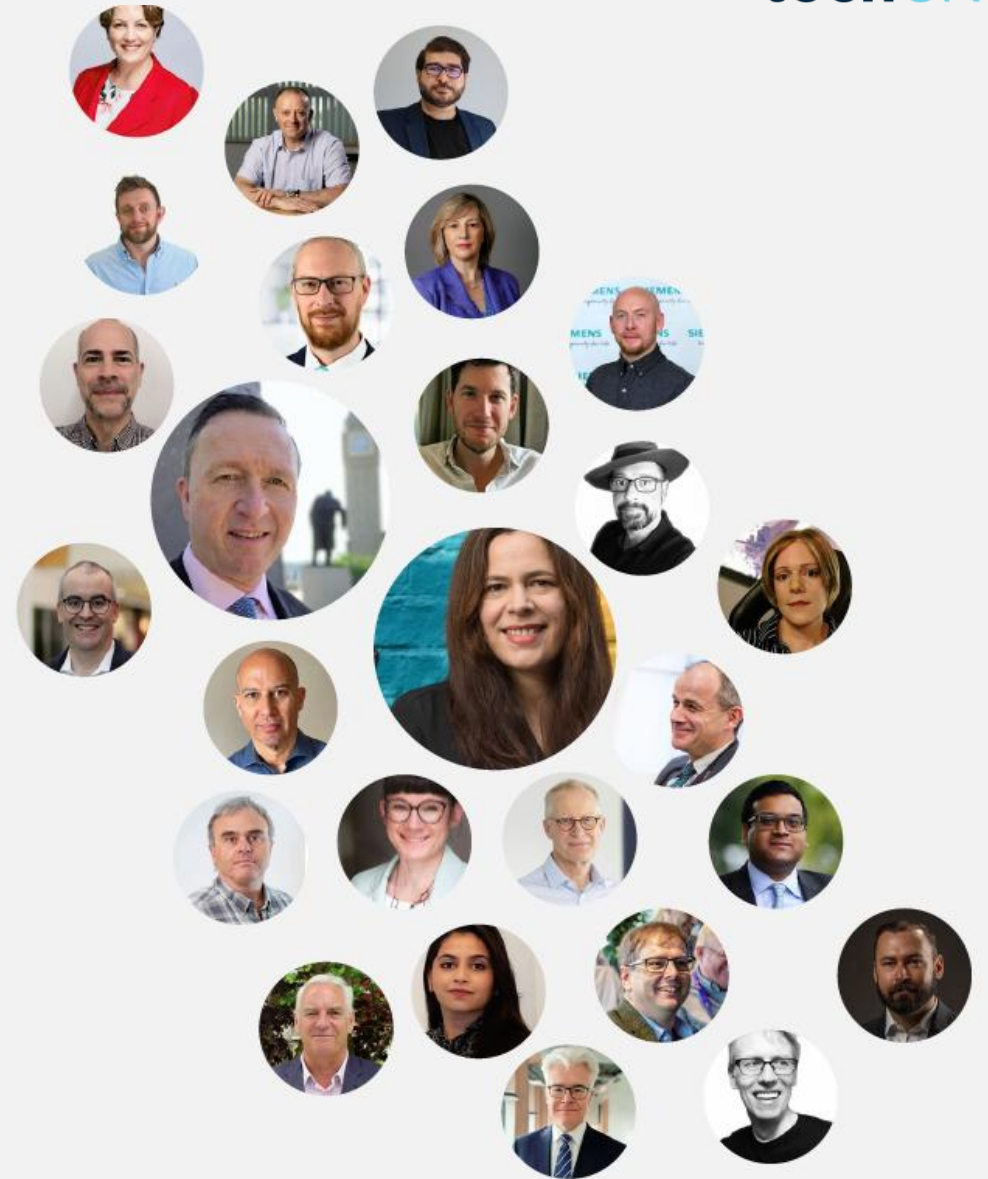

OT security and resilience in the electricity sector

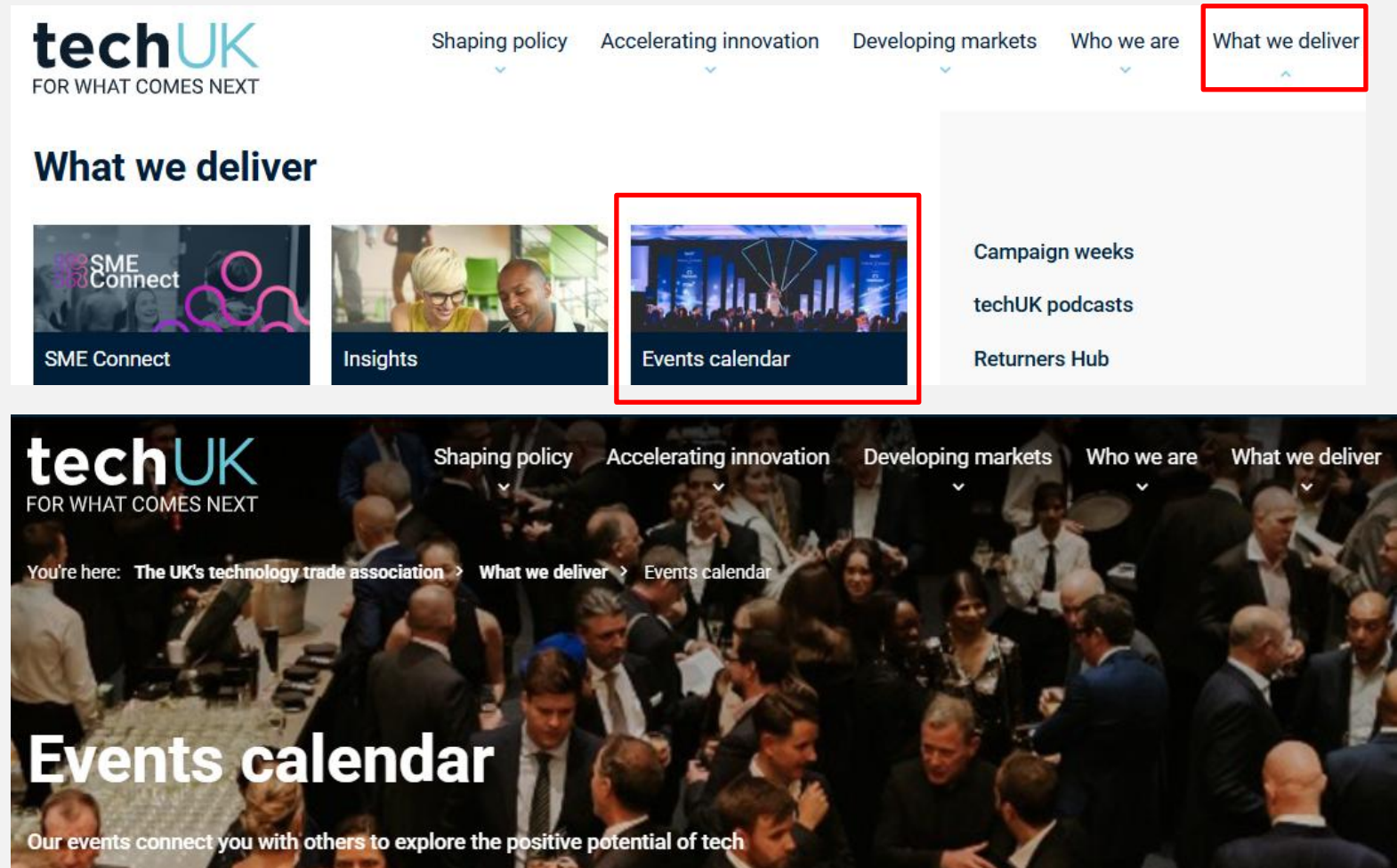
