Policy advocacy

techUK facilitates a powerful collaborative platform to influence the policy, strategic direction and delivery of digital, data and technology within the health, social care and life sciences sectors.

We then advocate these collective views directly to decision-makers across the NHS, central government, local authorities, and regulatory bodies like MHRA and NICE.

Through active engagement with a wide range of stakeholders, strategic responses to consultations, and thought leadership on pressing challenges, we're helping drive the digital transformation of the UK's health, social care and life sciences sectors.

Our strong voice and deep relationships with key stakeholders ensuring the voice of industry is heard at the highest levels of policy making. The Programme works though several channels of influence including:

- o Publishing <u>flagship reports</u>, <u>position papers</u> and <u>evidence packs</u>.
- Member-led working groups for the <u>social care</u> and <u>life sciences</u> sectors.
- o techUK-wide consultation responses, including:
 - Change NHS: help build a health service fit for the future
 - MHRA's consultation on statutory fees
 - NHS England and NICE's consultation on a new MedTech pathway
- Participating in Government-led policy working groups (e.g. 10 Year Health Plan); NHS England SME Advisory Group

techUK aims to lead the debate on digital technologies and provide a forum for government, NHS, and social care representatives to engage with the tech community.

We help government access leading industry expertise at an early stage in tackling challenges, and help our members improve their understanding of government requirements.

With over 65 events in 2024 alone, the Programme brings together key stakeholders from across the health, social care and life sciences ecosystem, allowing our members timely access to key information and the opportunity to shape governmental and NHS policy.

For instance, we recently...

- Facilitated several Pre-Market Engagement events With the <u>NHS</u>
 Genomic Medicine Service and <u>NHS London Procurement Partnership</u>
 for Workforce Technology Systems Framework.
- Curated roundtables on topics including <u>NHS Blood and Transplant</u> <u>Operations</u>, <u>Al in social care</u> and in <u>diagnostics and treatment</u>, <u>data</u> <u>federation</u>, and cyber security with National CISO Phil Huggins
- Hosted launch events of several major reports and initiatives, including the NHS England <u>Product and Platforms</u> Event and the <u>NHS</u> <u>Marketplace</u> Launch.
