March 2018 - Ofcom consultation on coverage obligations

 Evolution of 800 MHz auction where one licence had premises coverage obligations

For 700 MHz, Ofcom proposed:

- One obligation on improved coverage of premises (and their immediate surrounds)
- Two coverage obligations focused on providing increased geographic coverage in rural areas – UK-wide and Nations



MNO dialogue and engagement with Ofcom and DCMS




But:

- How do we tackle the frustration of partial coverage?
- Can we achieve these aims with a better value outcome than 700 MHz coverage obligation proposal?

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
Objectives underpinned by licences

1	Each MNO to reach nation specific coverage & 88 per cent of UK by mid-2024
2	Each MNO to reach nation specific coverage & 90 per cent of UK within 6 years of state aid
3	Collectively provide additional coverage to 280,000 premises and 16,000km of roads within 6 years of state aid

Combined effect is an expectation of 95 per cent UK landmass coverage by end 2025




2020 Baseline Coverage of each MNO






Common area covered by all operators





Partial Not Spots (PNS) - funded by MNOs

Improving coverage in areas where not all MNOs have 4G coverage: MNO funded






Total Not Spots (TNS) & ESN Extended Area Service (EAS)


TNS: focused on remote areas where no operator has coverage and where MNOs will share sites: grant funded

EAS: Home Office sites upgraded to enable all MNOs to provide 4G coverage: intragovernment and grant funded





Approx. £1 billion investment in total





SRN progress

First PNS sites already activated

One MNO has already activated two new sites as parts of its PNS efforts: one in Wales and one in the Peak District

31 July 2020 initial radio plans submitted

MNOs submitted their initial radio plans to Ofcom. These will be subject to change as more work is undertaken to assess feasibility of sites

Public funding and market engagement

For publicly funded elements, engagement with supplier ecosystem through an open process in line with public contract regulations now open
